Within a few weeks, my environmental health team and I will be conducting a biomonitoring study on young children in the Notre-Dame neighbourhood.

In the past, studies have been conducted locally to assess lead and arsenic levels in children. In accordance with our mission, which is to ensure the maintenance, improvement of health and well-being of the population, **we will be soliciting the cooperation of parents of children aged 9 months to less than 6 years old** (born between October 13th 2012 and February 13th 2018) to develop a new portrait of the environmental exposure of all children in the Notre-Dame neighbourhood.
